FLAMA 2025 PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES – BIODIVERSITY CATEGORY

Our Theme for 2025: "End Pollution Conserve the Environment – Komesha Uchafuzi Hifadhi Mazingira" calls on you to tackle pollution head-on and find creative ways to protect our precious environment.

Who Can Be a Champion?

- All Primary, Junior School and Secondary Schools and Special Need Learner Schools in Kenya are invited to participate.
- Schools *must* register to participate through the official FLAMA online portal <u>www.flama.go.ke</u>. Make sure you don't miss out!

What's Your Challenge? Here's What You Need to Do:

- 1. **Document a School Biodiversity Project:** This is where your school's creativity shines! Showcase what your School is currently doing or pick one or more of these exciting ideas:
 - Tree Nursery Establishment: Start a tree nursery or tree planting initiatives to green up your school and community.
 - Create a Pollinator Garden: Design a special garden for butterflies, bees, or birds with plants they love. JUKUMU LETU
 - Set up an Integrated School Garden: Plant and grow different types of food crops together- think of a vibrant mix of vegetables, fruits, and herbs!
 - Be a Waste Warrior: Showcase methods of managing waste sustainably in your school such as composting, rainwater harvesting, or innovative ways to manage waste sustainably
 - Document Your Local Heroes: Identify and protect the unique plants and animals (local species) that live in and around your school. Show us how you're safeguarding them!

- 2. **Create an Awesome Documentary:** Tell your project's story in a short video!
 - Length: Your video should be 3 5 minutes long and in MP4 format (audio visual).
 - Content: Showcase your school's biodiversity project, explain what you did, why it matters, and most importantly, how learners like you were involved every step of the way.
 - Presentation: Use simple narration or clear captions. Start with a brief intro from a teacher/ learner), then let one student or a group of students take over and shine as they present the project!
 - **Tech Tip:** You can even use mobile phones with basic video functions to record your masterpiece!
 - Upload: During upload, provide a title (10 words) and short description of the video (50 words)

3. Show Off Your Skills (Core Competencies):

- We want to see your creativity, your problem-solving skills, and your environmental responsibility in action!
- Highlight how students led, collaborated, and actively participated in all the activities.
- Did you partner with local community groups or other youth clubs? Tell us about it!

4. Connect to Global Goals and FLAMA Goals:

Your project isn't just local; it's part of a global movement! Show how your efforts link to at least 3 of these important Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):

- **SDG 4: Quality Education** (How did you learn and teach others?)
- SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation (Did you save water or manage it better?)
- **SDG 13: Climate Action** (How did your project help fight climate change?)
- **SDG 15: Life on Land** (This is all about biodiversity protecting plants and animals!)
- **SDG 17: Partnerships** (Did you work with others to make your project happen?)

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

- Students from all public and private Primary, Junior, and Secondary
 Schools are welcome, including those from special/integrated/inclusive schools.
- Each school can submit only ONE entry in the Biodiversity category,
 so make it your best!
- Your school *must* be registered on the FLAMA online portal (www.flama.go.ke)

What Won't Count? (Ineligible Submissions):

- Entries not created by a registered school or learner.
- Projects that have been submitted before for similar awards.
- Submissions without geotagged photos (where possible) as proof of your school project. We need to see your amazing work in action!

How to Send in Your Awesome School Entries:

- **Video Format:** Your 3-5 minute audiovisual video must be in MP4 format and submitted on the FLAMA portal.
- **Simple Recording:** Don't worry about fancy equipment! You can use mobile phones with basic video functions.
- **Presentation Style:** Start with a brief teacher/learner introduction, then let either one student or a group of students take the lead in presenting the project.

 Verification: The winning schools in each category will receive a visit from our judges and consultants to confirm the authenticity of your incredible projects.
